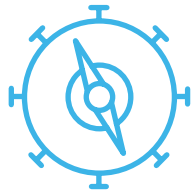


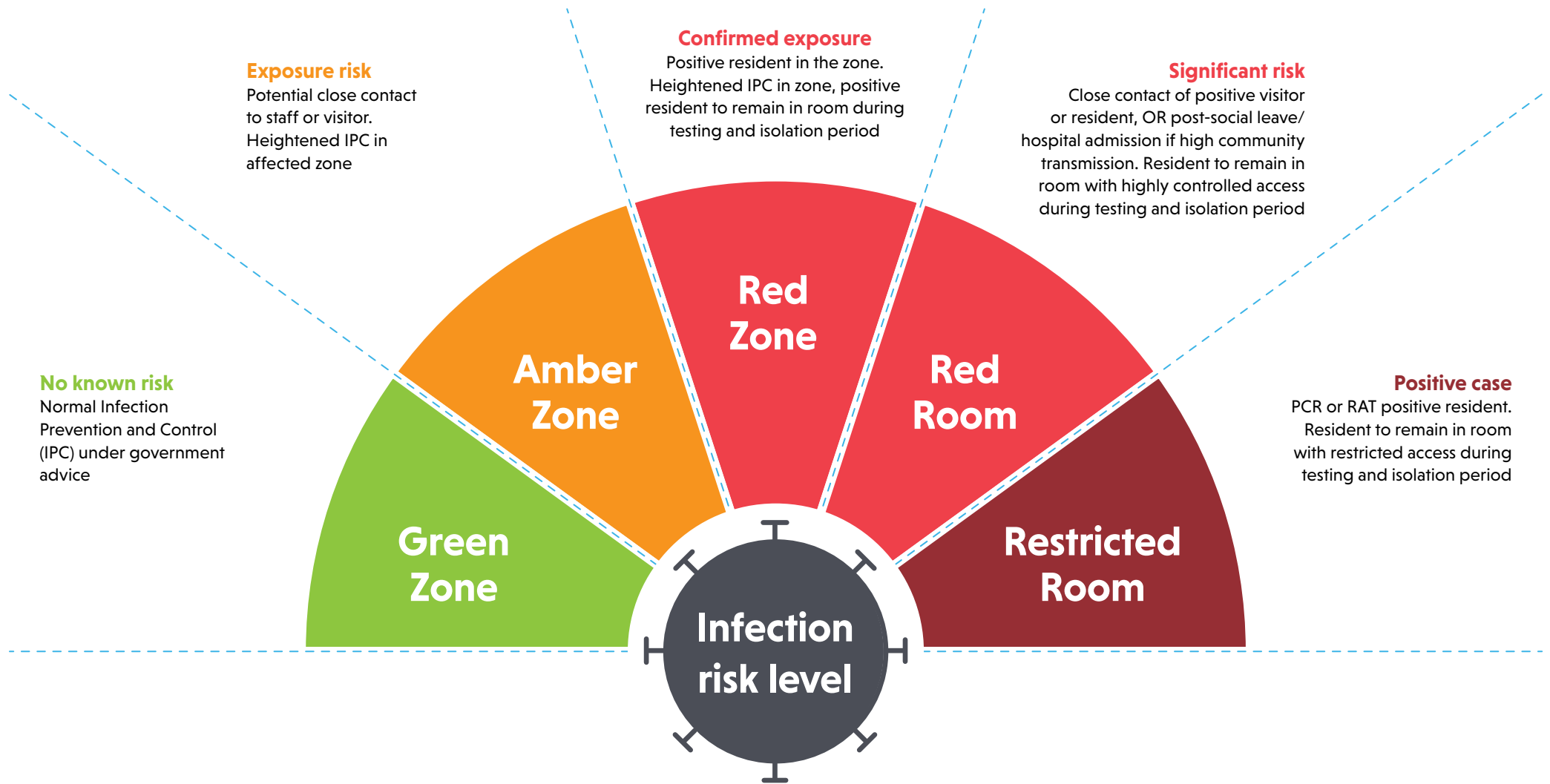
Acute Respiratory Infections Navigation Plan





Acute Respiratory Infections

This plan responds to the level of risk and exposure identified, from no known risk to significant risk, and positive cases. These measures are designed to ensure the ongoing safety and wellbeing of residents, their families and staff.



Visiting (page 1 of 2)

This plan will remain dynamic to ensure NSW & ACT Health expectations and directives are considered.

Visitation according to infection risk	<p>Minimal restrictions. To facilitate safer visits, visitors may be asked to wear masks, undergo RAT testing and sign a visitor declaration. Any additional advice from NSW & ACT Health will be observed and implemented as a minimum.</p>	<p>Restrictions may apply. Unrestricted visiting for partners in care, end of life and compassionate visits. Garden visits with physical distancing preferred. Visitors must wear two points of PPE, even in outdoor areas, undergo testing and be fully vaccinated*. Young (inability to wear PPE) and/or unvaccinated children not encouraged, but must be supervised if visiting.</p>	<p>Restrictions apply. Minimal visitors. Exception: End of life, partners in care and emotional support visits when safe to do so. Garden visits preferred. Visitors must wear four points of PPE, undergo testing and be fully vaccinated*. Children are not permitted in a red zone.</p>	<p>Restrictions apply. Generally, no visitors. There are circumstances when a partner in care may be able to visit and/or an emotional support visit may take place, dependent on resident needs, local knowledge, and facility layout. Visitors must wear four points of PPE, undergo testing and be fully vaccinated*. Children are not permitted in a red room.</p>	<p>Restrictions apply. Generally, no visitors. Extraordinary circumstances may occur when a partner in care, end of life or emotional visit may take place with NSW & ACT Health consent as appropriate. Visitors must wear five points of PPE, undergo testing and be fully vaccinated*.</p>

*Exception may apply to end of life cases only

Resident outings according to infection risk

Residents may choose to leave the facility at any time. However, when the level of risk in the community is considered high, residents are strongly advised against leaving, unless seeking urgent medical treatment.

Because risk assessment is an individualised process, we cannot give a definitive answer in relation to testing, physical distancing and if necessary, isolation. However, it is reasonable to suggest that if there are high transmission rates within the community, a period of isolation on return may be likely.

If a resident does choose to leave the facility, they will be provided with appropriate PPE, infection control and mask wearing advice. However, family members are asked to assist the resident in maintaining their safety.

Follow NSW & ACT Health isolation guidelines.

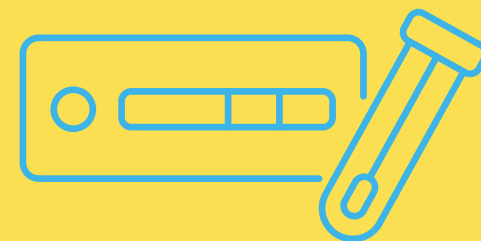

Access and movement	Usual movement and access, nil changes.	Exposed residents can choose to leave their room to eat in the dining room and participate in social activities with other residents within the same zone. Residents encouraged to exercise in corridors, use garden areas and communal rooms. Infections Navigation Plan will be in place to support physical distancing and resident safety.	Exposed and at high risk residents must isolate in their rooms for 7 days from exposure risk. Access to balconies and garden areas will be encouraged in line with Infections Navigation Plan (e.g physical distancing and safe entry and exit points, resident needs and preferences). Unexposed residents can choose to leave their room to eat in the dining room and participate in social activities with other unexposed residents within the same zone.	Residents must isolate in their rooms for 7 days from exposure risk or while they still have symptoms, with access to their balcony and potentially garden – based on an individualised risk assessment including potential impact on other residents. Door to resident room to remain closed. Residents with the same condition can choose to engage in social activities together if they are well enough to do so and if they can be kept separated from residents who are exposed or unaffected.	Residents must isolate for 7 days from symptom onset or test date if asymptomatic. Release from isolation after Day 7 if no symptoms for 24hrs – no testing required. Resident should be able to sit on their balcony – based on an individualised risk assessment including impact on other residents. Residents with the same condition can choose to engage in social activities together if they are well enough to do so and if they can be kept separated from residents who are exposed or unaffected. Where possible residents should wear a mask for up to 10 days after they test positive to infection, particularly when there are other people around and in communal areas.
